We hope we can count on your vote in the Democratic state primary. This year, in the interest of keeping everyone safe, we need to do things differently. The Massachusetts legislature has approved a new law to permit **voting by mail** for the September 1st primary.

Voting by mail is a TWO-STEP process.

1. You should have received an application from the Secretary of the Commonwealth for a mail-in ballot. Complete your application, then *deliver or send* it to the Town Clerk's office. Since there have been delays by the US Postal Service, we recommend physically dropping off your application to the Town Clerk's office.

2. In 1-2 weeks, you will receive your ballot. Complete it and *deliver or send* it to the Town Clerk by August 22nd in time for it to arrive by Election Day. We again recommend physically dropping off your ballot to the Town Clerk.

**Please be sure that every registered voter in your household separately requests their own ballot.*

Alternatively, you can **“early vote” in-person** if you want to avoid the crowds on September 1st.

1. It will be held between Saturday, August 22nd and Friday, August 28th at the Town Hall at 65 East Main St, Avon
